The Kayenta Arts Foundation is a reality! Incorporated in February, the Foundation's mission is "to develop and create an environment that fosters diverse artistic endeavors for educational and enrichment purposes." The initial Board of Directors has been busy laying the groundwork for this new non-profit corporation. Bylaws and policies have been adopted; goals and objectives are being formulated; an application for 501 (c)(3) tax exemption is in process, and a vision statement is evolving. 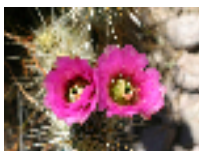

Spring Message from your Kayenta Planting Committee.  
A reminder to utilize the "Landscaping Regulations and Guidelines" when planning your new additions. You can go to [kayentahoa.com](http://kayentahoa.com) to download a copy (copies also available at the sales office). We just updated and expanded the Guidelines, so if you don't find the 2011 version on the website, it should be there soon! Hopefully you used a pre-emergent last autumn and your courtyard is not covered with weeds. But if you procrastinated too long (as did most of us) now is the time to attack those weeds while their root systems are still shallow and the ground is still moist. The early bloomers are getting ready for their showy debut and most of the native plants are showing signs that the sap is rising. You should be noticing that the newer stems are changing color and the buds are swelling. Now is the time for spring pruning. Be cautious as you clean up the winter kill, several species of plants are late risers (e.g. desert willow, desert indigo) and they will appear dead long after most of the rest of the plants in the area have already leafed out. Enjoy your Spring Planting Season!

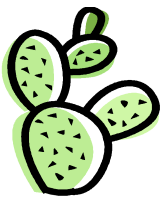
