Bees and beekeeping have been a subject of much interest this year in Kayenta. Lately there have been several reports of Bee "Swarms". Bee "swarming" is an expansive optimistic act by which honey bees reproduce their colonies. It is driven by the all powerful and natural urge to reproduce. This is not a spontaneous event as they plan this event several weeks in advance. At the right time, the queen and about half of the flying bees leave their hive to find a new place to make their home. At this time they are extremely passive.

As you may know, the honey bees world-wide are endangered and vanishing. It is extremely helpful to capture them and move them to hives where they can be managed naturally by "Custodial" beekeepers.

If you see a "swarm" or a mass of bees attached to a tree limb or elsewhere PLEASE call me! I will do my best to capture the swarm and put them in a hive out in "Wild Utah".

Also, watch for an announcement of an upcoming event—the award winning documentary "The Vanishing of the Bees" to be held at the Kayenta Outdoor Theater.
